- **Dr. Shirley Mueller:** Dr. Mueller is an Adjunct Associate Professor of Neurology at the Indiana University School of Medicine. She is an internationally known collector and scholar of Chinese export porcelain, as well as a physician board-certified in Neurology and Psychiatry. She has published numerous articles and is the author of *Inside the Head of a Collector: Neuropsychological Forces at Play*.
- **Dr. Helena Winston:** Dr. Winston is the Medical Director, Psychiatry Adult Inpatient Unit, Denver Health and Assistant Professor, Psychiatry, University of Colorado School of Medicine whose work intersects with the arts, humanities, and mental health. Previously, she was an art-book editor for the Guggenheim Museum in New York. She has an MSc in material anthropology from Oxford University and an MPhil in art history from the Graduate Center of the City University of New York.

- **Nan Ellin:** Nan Ellin is Dean Emeritus and Professor of Urban Design at the University of Colorado Denver. She is the co-convener of Design/HEALTH, aiming to improve design at every scale – from the home to the biome – to enhance the health and wellbeing of all people and our planet. Dr. Ellin holds a PhD from Columbia University, and her writings have been translated into thirteen languages.
