This is going to be a busy autumn. I am eagerly looking forward to the first Figurative Art Convention & Expo (FACE), to be convened by Fine Art Connoisseur in Miami November 8-11. In addition to all of the gifted artists sharing their technical secrets, we will be thrilled to welcome the remarkable guest speakers recently announced by our collaborator, Prof. Michael Pearce. They include Prof. Donald Kuspit, best known for his groundbreaking book The End of Art, and Dr. Elliot Bostwick Davis, who has curated major exhibitions at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, including the recent Jamie Wyeth retrospective. Eric Rhoads and I really look forward to welcoming you to the lovely Biltmore Hotel in sunny Coral Gables this November.

Before then, I will be enjoying some artistic stimulation in my own city of New York. Set to occur October 13-14 is the Collectors for Connoisseurship (C4C) Arts Weekend, hosted by Windows to the Divine, a Denver-based foundation that encourages patronage and philanthropy through the arts. C4C is a national network of collectors and art lovers who meet

in person annually, interact through an online forum, and personify the importance of viewing art in person and collecting art themselves, thereby supporting professional artists directly.

On October 13, C4C will convene a symposium at the Metropolitan Museum of Art with the highly relevant theme Patronage and Collecting: Then & Now. Participating that afternoon will be three distinguished curators from the Metropolitan, the Frick, and the Morgan, C4C founder Shannon Robinson, art adviser Betsy Thomas, dealer Shelley Farmer, collector Gregory Peterson, and myself.

That evening we will head to the Salmagundi Club to celebrate the opening of C4C's benefit exhibition and sale, Revelry & Revelation: Realism Today. On view there through October 23 will be impressive paintings by Nicholas Evans-Cato (including the magnificent Brooklyn Bridge scene illustrated here), Max Ferguson, David Fertig, Scott Fraser, Diana Horowitz, Michael Klein, Lucong, Jill Soukup, Skip Steinworth, Amy Weiskopf, and Vincent Xeus.
